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PROGRESS REVIEW OF PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES DEVELOPMENT 1986 - 1990

The Board adopted the Psychiatric Services Development Plan in April 1986. This review is based on discussions and submissions from senior professional staff and activity data which reflects the essential change in the service profile during the last 4 years.

The 1986 strategy, based on "Planning for the Future", emphasised a new direction focused on a community orientated, patient centred service. Change was underwritten by policies to transfer resources to community facilities, the development of rehabilitation skills and programmes and the placement of in-patients in settings appropriate to their needs. The development of organisational arrangements and operational policies and procedures during the review period has facilitated the achievement of service goals and have proven to be sufficiently adaptable to a variety of settings. The Multi-disciplinary Team Model, led by a Consultant Psychiatrist, is an effective arrangement for hospital based care groups and sector services.

The combination of reducing capital and revenue availability and periodic change-related difficulties have demanded a high level of resourcefulness and commitment from all concerned.

The impetus of the development of alternative services is steady and can be clearly ascertained in the accompanying data. The period 1990 - 1994 will see a significant shift from the Victorian Institutions to the new service facilities in this and other Health Board areas.

POPULATION:

The 1981 Census data was used in preparing the 1986 Plan. The principal change noted in the 1986 Census was the increase of 7,300 in the Board's population. The greatest increase occurred in the 25 - 44 age range for all of the Catchment Areas, i.e., 11,312 persons. The 75 yrs+ group increased by 910 in the Board's area, of which 673 were Limerick based. Sector populations were not greatly affected, although it was found necessary to adjust Limerick Sector boundaries to give a more equitable distribution. The population profile of this Board's area is included for reference, e.g., the percentage of single males 15 yrs+ is 22.23% compared with single females 15 yrs+ at 33.02% in the Marital Status TABLE.

IN-PATIENT POPULATION:

The Hospital Zones are defined as:

The current % distribution of patients in these groups in St. Joseph's, Limerick, Our Lady's, Ennis and St. Luke's, Clonmel show some differences, e.g.:

The in-patient population of St. Joseph's Hospital reduced from 610 at year-end 1985 to 394 at year-end 1989. The current position is 370 residents. Further transfers to St. Camillus' Hospital in 1990 and the provision of supported community residences will bring the in-patient population close to 300 by early 1991.

In Our Lady's Hospital, Ennis, Patient No's. reduced from 470 at year-end 1985 to 323 at year-end 1989. The provision of supported community residences and additional housing accommodation will further reduce the in-patient population to 260 in early 1991.

These reductions represent an improvement in the quality of life for hospital residents who are currently participating in Special Rehabilitation Programmes.

The In-patient No's, for Tipperary (N.R.) persons resident in St. Luke's Hospital, Clonmel, reduced from 156 at year-end 1985 to 102 at year-end 1989.

IN-PATIENTS - 31.12.989

New Long-Stay (1-5 yrs): In St. Joseph's Hospital, Limerick, this Group was 11.42% of the population; in Our Lady's, Ennis, 10.22%. The annual average growth in this Group in the Limerick Hospital is 9 per annum. However, 2 Sectors report no person in this Group in the last 2 years. The position in Clare is 6.5 per annum. Further analysis is required across all Sectors to identify more clearly the circumstances which give rise to varying rates of prevalence in this Group on an annual basis.

Old Long-Stay - 31.12.89 This Group was 64.21% of the Limerick Hospital population. In Our Lady's, Hospital, Ennis, 71.52%. The 36.75% of the Limerick Group were persons 65 years and over and 36.36% of the Clare Group.

MENTAL HANDICAP:

Following an assessment by the Bawnmore Service, patients in this category were classified in accordance with their level of disability and suitability for transfer to the Mental Handicap Service. In the light of the resource implications an interim measure was adopted by hospital zoning in St. Joseph's, Limerick and Our Lady's, Ennis. This arrangement has enabled the Functional Teams in both hospitals to design and implement special Programmes for individuals and groups.

At present there are 56 persons in the St. Joseph's Hospital zone and it is proposed to place another 11 who have special needs in a Special Care Unit. Our Lady's Hospital zone has 46 and discussions on dedesignation are now at an advanced stage. The Clare Community Care Team will extend its remit to this in-patient group pending transfers to the Bawnmore Service and this arrangement will present new opportunities to develop services for the Mentally Handicapped in the Clare area.

Initial steps on dedesignation have been taken in Limerick.

The current policy seeks to place all mentally handicapped persons in institutional care in more appropriate environments. The transfer of such persons and resources to the Bawnmore Service will advance their community services development in this Board's area.

PSYCHOGERIATRIC:

The 65 yrs+ population in St. Joseph's, Limerick is 126; Our Lady's, Ennis 67 and St. Luke's, Clonmel 18 (Tipperary N.R.).

In recent years more than 200 elderly persons have been transferred from the Board's Psychiatric Hospitals to its Geriatric Service. These transfers have resulted in the establishment of a Psychogeriatric Unit in St. Joseph's Hospital, Ennis, and the integration of former patients of St. Joseph's Hospital with those in St. Camillus' and St. Ita's Hospitals.

The current projects in Limerick will provide a Psychogeriatric Unit in St. Camillus' Hospital under the clinical direction of a Consultant Psychiatrist. A similar Unit is under consideration for St. Ita's, Newcastle West.

The provision of long-stay psychogeriatric care in geriatric hospitals is not a new development as dependant elderly have traditionally been referred to those hospitals. The current policy, which is designed to prevent long-stay admissions to psychiatric hospitals, focuses on the needs of the elderly person in an appropriate setting.

The initial policy of transferring these elderly persons to geriatric hospitals will ensure that new long-stay persons who are described as Elderly Mentally Ill, will have a facility supported by Consultants in Psychiatry and Geriatrics, and the mix of skills and programmes relevant to their needs. Those who do not need institutional care will be cared for by the community services. The important consideration in planning for Elderly Mentally Infirm is that their needs are often complex and require a high level of liaison and co-operation from all health specialties.

ADMISSIONS:

The implementation of Admission Policies for the Board's Psychiatric Hospitals and Units has effected a reduction in inappropriate admissions and directed stronger attention to rely on community services. At this stage admissions in the <u>Limerick area</u> have been successfully restricted to the Acute Psychiatric Unit at the Regional Hospital. Current Planning Norms and acute bed provision limits access to persons who are domiciled in the Catchment Area.

Admissions to <u>St. Joseph's Hospital</u> reduced from 1,505 in 1985 to 698 in 1989; admissions to the Acute Unit increased from 548 to 791 as a result of the restriction on access to St. Joseph's Hospital.

The admission rate for the Limerick area 1985 - 1989 decreased from 12.7 per 1,000 to 9.05 per 1,000. The 1990 trend indicates a continuing reduction.

During 1989, the First Admissions to St. Joseph's Hospital as a % of all admissions had reduced to 14.75% as against 26.24% in 1982. Direct admissions to St. Joseph's Hospital, Limerick, however, are now restricted in accordance with policy.

The 1989 admissions data for St. Joseph's Hospital indicated that 50% were 44 years of age or less; in 1982 this group was in excess of 60% of admissions. The corresponding data for Unit 5B is 48.67% and 51.5%.

Male admissions to St. Joseph's in 1989 were 56.2% of all admissions, and to Unit 5B, 52% as against 59.7% and 42.8% in 1985. Admissions to Our Lady's Hospital reduced from 712 in 1985 to 580 in 1989. The admission rate for the Clare area 1985 - 1989 decreased from 8.13 per 1,000 to 6.35 per 1,000.

The First Admissions to Our Lady's as a % of all admissions reduced to 21.38% in 1989 from 26.48% in 1982.

The Age Group 44 years and less accounted for 51.38% of all admissions in 1989; in 1982 that group had 47.21% of admissions. Male admissions to Our lady's in 1989 was 61.55% as against 57.87% in 1985.

Admissions to St.Luke's, Clonmel from Tipperary (N.R.) 1988 and 1989 were 398 and 345 respectively, i.e., an admission rate of 6.74 per 1,000 and 5.85 per 1,000.

The <u>National comparative data</u> on psychiatric hospitals 1987 is the most recently published information of its kind. In reviewing the current position of the Mid-Western Health Board Service it is essentially historical. Nevertheless, for reference purposes it is worth noting certain items of interest:

 The National average in comparing admissions 1987 was 6.75 per 1,000. At that time Our Lady's, Ennis, rate was 7.56; the Limerick hospitals 11.04 and St. Luke's, Clonmel, 10.47. Depressive Disorders

The Socio-Economic Group, unskilled manual, had a National

admission rate of 22.16 per 1,000, the corresponding rate for

the Mid-Western Health Board area was 31.298 per 1,000.

ALCOHOLISM:

The issues arising from current treatment arrangements and resource implications in the Psychiatric Service demand specific analysis and review. This will be undertaken shortly.

The National admission profile on this diagnosis is 26.8% of all first admissions and 21.4% of all admissions. This diagnosis represents 15.3% of all admissions to General Hospital Psychiatric Units. Many do not, in fact, require hospital admission and can be treated adequately on an out-patient basis. The provision of Day Hospitals in Sectors has assisted, in many instances, the development of out-patient detoxification programmes. Detoxification facilities and practices will be subject to ongoing review in conjunction with community services assessment and residential and out-patient rehabilitation.

The Treatment/Rehabilitation Programme in Rathbane House has been successful with an annual throughput of 50 persons participating.

The residential facility at Bushy Park, Ennis, will be available this year under the Administration of CLARECARE. The 12 place programme will be provided with service-management input from Health Board staff.

REHABILITATION:

The key to de-institutionalisation is essentially a combination of Admission Policy and the Rehabilitation Programme in both hospitals.

Restoration of social and self-management skills for many people who had become dependant on the institution as a way of life presented a worthwhile professional challenge to many staff.

The Behaviourial Therapy Course provided in collaboration with the Department of Applied Psychology U.C.C. and in-service training presented staff with the opportunity to reassess and enhance their own skills for the benefit of patients transferring to community residences.

LIMERICK: Since the Special Rehabilitation Programme was established in May 1986, 99 former long-stay patients have been returned to community living. As the number who are deemed suitable for independent living is small, the focus of the Rehabilitation Programme will shift to a community base.

The work of the Rehabilitation Team will therefore concentrate primarily on city based supported community residences. In the hospital, the rehabilitation emphasis is now place at Ward level. The Long-stay High and Low Dependency Groups in St. Joseph's, i.e., 153 persons and New Long-Stay Low Dependency, i.e., 17 persons, are now the subject of the new direction in Rehabilitation Policy and transfer to the community.

CLARE: The special Rehabilitation Programme commenced in Our lady's Hospital in October 1987 and has placed 58 persons in the community.

There are 67 persons at present in the three levels of the Programme, Rehabilitation Assessment 38; Rehabilitation Ward 21; and Special Rehabilitation Unit 8. The projected level of initial placement indicates that a significant majority will be placed in supported community residences on a daily basis. As in the Limerick experience, the provision of higher support in certain community residences will shift to rehabilitation emphasis to these facilities. The number of persons classified as Long-stay High and Low Dependency in Our Lady's is 156. The Rehabilitation and Sector Teams will review this population with senior hospital staff to formalise future placement plans for them.

SECTOR SERVICES:

LIMERICK.

Teams and services are now well established in 4 Sectors. Delays in finalising the purchase of a property in the final Sector have been resolved and the last Sector Hq./Day Hospital in the area will commence this year.

CLARE.

The 4th Sector Hq./Day Hospital will be provided as part of the Shannon Community Health Centre. An interim facility is currently under negotiation in order to enhance community service support this year.

TIPPERARY (N.R.).

The Thurles Sector commenced its Day Hospital service in April 1990. This development has been undertaken in collaboration with the South Eastern Health Board.

The Multi-Disciplinary Team, led by the Sector Psychiatrist, has organisational and clinical responsibility for service delivery in its area. This includes acute interventions and preventative programmes, support of chronic cases in the community and the residential and day care facilities in the Sector. The requirement of continuity of care means that the Team follows through their client support in Secondary and Tertiary care to ensure that each referral to acute in-patient care etc., is restored to the community without unnecessary delay.

The impact of the Sector Services in reducing admission rates is evident in most of the Sectors. The following TABLE illustrates the change in admission rate in each Sector, 1987 - 1989.

It should be noted that 2 Clare Sectors commenced in April 1986 and that the other Sectors in Clare and Limerick commenced in the second half of 1988.

The significant reductions in a relatively short time-span reflects intensive input by professional staff and the creation of greater community awareness and confidence in the Acute front-line services. A special project which is designed to evaluate the effect of intensifying professional input in a Limerick City Sector has, in an 11 week period, already given positive indications of significant reduction in hospital admissions from that Sector.

Several Sectors emphasise their crisis intervention role with strengthening of co-ordinated effort with the Primary Care Service.

The emphasis of the <u>Day Hospital</u> is on acute care and prevention. The Sector Team also liaises with the Hospital Teams, particularly Rehabilitation, in preparing persons for discharge to community residences and supporting them in their new environment. The relevant TABLE on this provision is as follows:

The general view at this point suggests that the majority of future long-stay discharges will require daily support in the community. New long-stays who are not elderly will be accommodated in supported residences and participate in active rehabilitation programmes.

The role of the Sector Team needs strengthening to respond to the demands of the non-acute dimensions of the service in its care. Non-availability of capital is inhibiting the rate of expansion of community services on all fronts. This situation is also reflected with some exception on the availability of Local Authority Housing for this Board's purposes.

Day Centres are an essential component in the community support system for chronic psychiatric conditions. While an element of the Day Hospital service provides this need it is intended to provide a separate arrangement, where possible, in Sectors.

At present there is one Centre in Limerick city and 2 more planned for 1990. A Day Centre will be provided in Newcastle West later this year. There is one Centre in Ennis and a second planned to open later this year. Centres are also planned for Kilrush and Scariff this year.

Transport is vital, particularly in rural areas. This provision has been made in Limerick, Newcastle West, Kilrush and Thurles. Vehicles are currently shared with Day Hospital Services for the Elderly outside of Limerick. The expansion of this service is planned for all Sectors subject to resources.

Voluntary Organisations have a greater role to fulfil in the future. At present there are 2 Branches of the Mental Health Association in the region, i.e., Kilrush and Kilmallock. G.R.O.W. is very active in the region in recent years and has already established 12 Groups. "AWARE" is participating in patient support and advise in the Limerick area. The Friends of St. Joseph's and the St. Vincent dePaul Groups in the area continue to play an important role. It is hoped that "good neighbour" schemes will make a positive contribution to persons who need to be integrated into normal community living

OUT-PATIENT CLINICS:

The frequency of these services has been increased to once, and in some instances twice per week in some areas, to deal with G.P. referrals on a regular basis.

This improved service contributes to the reduced incidence of readmission to hospital and provides additional screening and
treatment of acute referrals. The specific Sector information on
Clinics is contained in TABLES 48, 49 and 50. The following TABLE
summarises the catchment areas position for 1989.

COMMUNITY RESIDENCES:

LIMERICK: Former patients are accommodated in 12 residences in the City and 1 in the County. There are 82 places at present with a minimum additional 32 places planned for occupation this year and 10 other places which should be available by early 1991.

CLARE: There are 9 Hostels in Clare, providing 56 places for former patients and a minimum additional 32 places planned for 1990 and 25 other places which should be available by early 1991.

Not all former patients are housed in Board residences as some have opted for independent arrangements but, nevertheless, have contact with the service through the Community Nursing and Day Care Services.

WORKSHOPS:

Training and sheltered workshops have been developed within the Programme to provide patients with skills and independence. The ideal outcome is work placement in all cases.

The Dulick Enterprise Centre is approved for 30 training places in Ennis and 10 in Kilrush. There are 25 persons in sheltered employment in the Centre at present. RETOS will be utilised for appropriate referrals from the South Clare Sector.

The Mulgrave Enterprise Centre, at present based in St.Joseph's Hospital, Limerick, will be transferred to an Industrial Estate. There are 34 places approved for training in the Centre and 19 persons in sheltered employment. Newcastle West is being provided with a 12 place workshop this year to cater for the needs of the West Limerick area. The Tipperary (N.R.) position in this regard has been the subject of discussion with the N.R.B. and the Brothers of Charity.

ACUTE UNITS:

LIMERICK:

The Acute Psychiatric Unit, Dooradoyle, provides the Secondary Care Services for the Catchment area. There are 50 beds approved for the population of Limerick City and County. A Planning Brief has been submitted to the Project Team responsible for the Regional Hospital Development Control Plan, and the development of the Unit has been given priority by the Department of Health. It will be necessary to undertake some interim improvements to the Unit in the light of the policy on admissions to acute care.

CLARE:

Alternative options must be considered in the aftermath of the Cahercalla Project. That setback, in terms of the future status of acute psychiatric care and the needs of the mentally ill or distressed in Clare, will require a satisfactory alternative. A 30 Bed Unit is proposed for this Catchment Area.

TIPPERARY (N.R.):

Agreement in principle with the Department of Health on the provision of an Acute Unit at Nenagh General Hospital is recorded.

A 15/20 Bed Unit is proposed for this Catchment Area.

Capital Funding will limit progress and range of options on the provision of new facilities, or significant enhancement of existing buildings. In the meantime, greater emphasis is being placed on community interventions.

REGIONAL SPECIAL CARE UNIT:

A number of discussions have taken place with the Department of Health and the Catchment Teams on the needs of the chronically disturbed who will require intensive care on a continuous basis. A 20 place Unit is deemed appropriate to the needs of the Limerick and Clare area in the first instance. The patients will have a primary psychiatric diagnosis and will be screened in accordance with approved criteria. The Tipperary (N.R.) needs in this regard will be met by suitable arrangement with the South Eastern Health Board. The Mentally Handicapped disturbed will be catered for by the approved Agency.
