REPORT

OF

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

In presenting the Ninetieth Report of Cork-street Fever Hospital, the Managing Committee have again to congratulate themselves on the great usefulness of the Hospital during the past year, from the 1st April, 1893, to the 1st April, 1894, inasmuch as it has received within its walls and treated with the best medical skill available, 1,648 patients, being an increase of 339 on the previous year, which was the largest number admitted since the small-pox epidemic of 1878-'79. This makes a daily average of 107.83 beds filled, as against 85 last year. The past year has also been remarkable as being a record year for Typhoid Fever admissions, which reached 260, an increase of 79 over the number admitted during the previous year, the largest number up to then.

Of course this increased amount of work has resulted in a large addition to the cost, as the expenditure, leaving out the cost of the new Building, has exceeded the receipts by no less a sum than £1.572 19s. 1d.

The Managing Committee issued an Appeal towards the conclusion of the year 1893, which was very poorly responded to, as it only succeeded in increasing the item "Subscriptions and Donations" by some £240.

The Managing Committee return thanks to the Corporation of the City of Dublin for having restored their grant to its old amount of £300.

The Managing Committee having informed the Board of Guardians of the South Dublin Union of the state of their finances consequent upon the large increase in the number of fever patients treated, the Board agreed to contribute a certain sum per head towards the patients sent by them for the year ending December, 1894, of which the sum of £147 13s. is credited in the accounts for the year ending the 1st April last.

The Managing Committee have informed the North Dublin Union that they would be obliged to charge them at a like rate for their patients during the time that the Hospital was running at a loss.

The Managing Committee trust, however, that the public will come to their assistance as they did during the small-pox epidemic of 1878-'79, and enable them to treat all patients gratis.

The New Building has been completed with furniture at a cost of £4,778 4s. 4d., of which £1,966 14s. 8d. was charged in last year's account, and the balance £2,811 9s. 8d. is charged in this. This Building has been occupied by patients since August, 1893, and has proved thoroughly satisfactory.

The Managing Committee has been compelled to sell out Stock to the value of £3,356 10s. 5d.

Dr. O'Keeffe Wilson's term of office as Assistant Registrar having come to an end, his place has been filled by the appointment of Dr. Temple Smyth.

The Managing Committee have to lament the loss by death of Mr. Samuel Boyd, who was a great supporter of the Institution, and Governor since 1859.

The Committee regret to have to report the death of Wardmaid Kate Gouchier, of Typhus Fever, caught in the Hospital in discharge of her duty.

St. Vincent's, Jervis Street, Steevens', and St. Joseph's (Temple

Street) Hospitals, have arranged to send Probationers for a course of training in Fever Nursing.

The Managing Committee have much pleasure in returning thanks to their Staff generally for their very efficient conduct

during a very trying year.

The Lady Superintendent, Miss F. Hemberow Close, will be always pleased to receive donations of Clothing for patients of both sexes leaving the Hospital, as well as fruit, flowers, toys, and books and pictures of a suitable nature for the use of the patients. Illustrated papers, whether new or old, are most valuable.

No Legacy has been received by the Hospital during the past

year.

MEDICAL REPORT, 1893-94.

THE total number of cases admitted during the past year and treated to a conclusion in the Hospital amounts to 1,656, showing an increase over the previous year of 347 cases; this is the highest number reached since the Small Pox epidemic year of 1878-9.

There has been no extensive epidemic, and the increased admissions were principally made up of cases of Scarlatina, Erysipelas, Typhoid, and Pneumonia; also an increase in the number of general cases due to the fact that there is now much more enlightenment amongst the poorer classes as to the value of Special Fever Hospital treatment than there was some years ago, and consequently many patients now seek admission to our wards who would in former years have only come in when compelled by the Medical Officer of Health.

The general rate of mortality of all cases, 8.81 per cent., cannot be considered high when the number of patients admitted in a hopeless condition is taken into consideration.

Typhus Fever shows a further and gradual decrease since the year 1:83-4, when 350 cases were treated in the Hospital, last year the number was only seven; let us hope that in a short time this disease will have vanished from our list.

The cases of Typhoid were of a severe type, and there was an increase of seventy-nine over the previous year, 260 cases having been treated, altogether the highest number reached during the previous ten years. I fear that until an adequate system of main and sub-soil drainage is carried out for the entire city that we will have Typhoid Fever always with us.

The rate of mortality in the 251 cases of Measles treated has been high, chiefly in children under one year and also under five years, in the former class many of the infants were the badly nourished offspring of poorly fed mothers, and in the latter many of the little patients when admitted were already suffering from Catarrhal Pneumonia, sent in too late, in fact. I think the public have a tendency not to regard Measles in a sufficiently serious

light, and consequently the patients are not sent into Hospital early enough, very often not until some serious lung complication has occurred.

The large number of Erysipelas patients treated threw a great deal of additional work on the Resident Medical Officers and Nurses, as many of the cases were severe and required surgical interference and dressings which occupied much time.

The new building, containing 26 beds, which has been added to the accommodation of the Hospital and opened this year, is admirably suited for the treatment of Fever cases, being both well ventilated, lighted, and heated; it has proved very useful in the facility which it affords for the separation and isolation of the different forms of infectious disease.

I very much regret to have to report the great loss sustained by the Hospital through the death of Head Nurse Mary Walsh, who had been for many years in this capacity, a faithful servant of the Hospital, and a most excellent nurse; her death was not due to infectious disease.

The Management of the Hospital has been ably conducted by Dr. Day, the Resident Physician, and on behalf of the Visiting staff I would wish to thank himself, Dr. Wilson, Miss Close, and the Nursing Staff, for the great care and attention paid to the patients during the past busy year.
