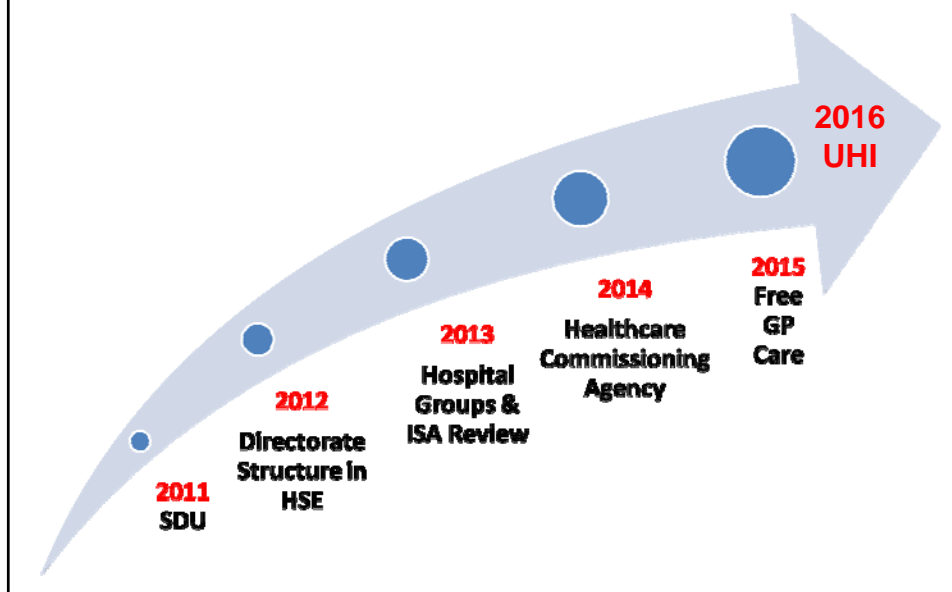

Key Timebound Actions

- 2012:
 - Communicate and consult
 - Preliminary paper on UHI
 - Produce timebound plan for implementation of Money Follows the Patient
 - Recommendations on Hospital Groups
 - Framework for Smaller Hospitals

Key Timebound Actions

- 2013
 - Publish White Paper on UHI
 - Programme Management Office
 - Patient Safety Agency
 - Review of ISAs
 - New Risk Equalisation Scheme
 - Establish Hospital Groups
 - Single assessment tool for older people's services
 - Assess applicability of Fair Deal to other sectors
 - Health Information Bill and eHealth Strategy

Key Timebound Actions

- 2014
 - Healthcare Commissioning Agency
 - Transfer Vote to Department of Health
 - Extend BreastCheck to 65-69 year old women
 - Reconfigure Ambulance Services
- 2015
 - Free GP care
 - Licensing of hospitals and specialist service providers
 - Establish independent Hospital Trusts

HSE in Transition

- **A new Directorate will be established**
 - New Directors for Hospitals, Primary Care, Social Care, Mental Health, Health and Wellbeing
 - Role of RDOs will remain crucial
- **New Directors will have a crucial job of work**
 - **Financial Reform:** Will give us real visibility on budgets
 - **Service Reform:** Will become key catalyst for service reform, e.g., primary care
 - **Structural Reform:** Will oversee introduction of a Purchaser Provider split
