# Co-ordinators of Postgraduate Medical Education

The Board employs part-time Co-ordinators of Postgraduate Medical Education. Their general duties are to co-ordinate and encourage the development of postgraduate education both at the level of programmed training and continuing education, to stimulate learning by all trainees and to co-operate with the Board, the professional training bodies and teaching hospitals in the promotion of postgraduate education. ## National Directorate, General Practitioner Continuing Education Programmes

During 2000 the Board funded the appointments under the auspices of the Irish College of General Practitioners of Dr. H. Finnegan, Ballinasloe and Dr. C. McNicholas, Dublin as National Director and Assistant National Director of Continuing Education Schemes respectively. Their role was to co-ordinate and encourage the development of the activities of the Tutors of those schemes and to establish and maintain a bank of educational resources for use by small groups.

# Tutors, General Practitioner Continuing Education Programmes

Each of the General Practitioner Continuing Education Programmes funded by the Board employs a part-time Tutor. The general duties of the Tutors are to promote, encourage and co-ordinate continuing education for the general practitioners in their areas both at an individual level and principally by promoting and encouraging the formation of small groups which should meet regularly in an informal atmosphere with the emphasis being on participation and discussion rather than didactic teaching. The Tutors provide guidance and resources for such small groups, seek to co-ordinate and integrate their programmes with other continuing medical education activities and seek to ensure that the principles of assessing needs, defining objectives, active problem-based learning and performance review apply. ### **Outline of Board's Activities**

The main activities undertaken under the aegis of the Board in 2000 could be summarised as follows:-

- prepared and submitted to the Minister for Health and Children a Position Paper outlining the Board's views on the enhanced role the Board should be enabled to undertake so that it would be facilitated in playing a key role in the formulation and implementation of policy relating to the promotion and delivery of postgraduate medical and dental education,
- continued to develop the Board's career guidance programme for young doctors,
- organised Medical Careers Fairs in Cork, Dublin and Galway for interns and first year house officers and to which medical students were also admitted; these fairs attracted overall attendances of about 175,
- made career guidance material more readily available and accessible by placing it on the Board's website,
- continued to fund, in partnership with the relevant health boards, regional dental committees in the East, Midlands, North-East, North-West, South-Mid-West, South-

East and in the West; the main function of the last six named regional committees is to promote continuing dental education (CDE) within their respective areas, with the Eastern Regional Dental Committee being principally concerned with the co-ordination of CDE in its area.

- formally introduced a Continuing Dental Education accreditation system [at 31 December, 2000 over 1,170 dentists were participating therein],
- organised a pilot scheme of vocational training in dentistry,
- employed a Co-ordinator for the Pilot Scheme of Vocational Training in Dentistry whose role concerns the promotion of co-ordinated vocational training of a high standard,
- commenced consideration as to how the Board should promote the development of a specialist training scheme in orthodontics,
- the Board was one of the member agencies on the Forum on Medical Manpower,
- conducted a census of NCHD staffing as at 1 October, 2000,
- agreed to consider preparing guidelines on the facilities and infrastructure which should be available in centres providing postgraduate medical and dental education,
- held discussions with representatives of the Northern Ireland and Scottish Councils for Postgraduate Medical and Dental Education,
- indicated to the Department of Health that facilities for study and research must be an integral part of specialist registrar training and that contractual arrangements should so provide,
- brought to the attention of the Department of Health and Children, the HSEA and the training bodies views expressed in a snapshot survey conducted by the Board among a small but influential and informed group of NCHDs in training,
- funded the provision of a residential communications skills workshop for NCHDs,
- agreed to subsidise the attendance of doctors and dentists at a course run in UCD leading to the Certificate in Healthcare Informatics,
- continued to administer a scheme whereby NCHDs are reimbursed the fees paid by them in respect of specified postgraduate examinations and courses,
- provided an administrative service for the Irish Psychiatric Training Committee and provided funds to that Committee to enable it to administer its national higher training scheme.
- agreed to provide funding to the Irish Psychiatric Training Committee in respect of the academic programme to be organised for senior registrars,

- agreed to fund the appointment of a national specialty director for child and adolescent psychiatry,
- funded the development of restructured higher specialist training schemes in anaesthetics, paediatrics, medicine, occupational medicine and surgery,
- agreed to contribute to the funding of a fifth training post in occupational medicine,
- agreed in principle to support financially the RCSI plan to begin the phased implementation of a national network of video conferencing.
- provided funding to the Faculty of Radiologists in respect of a "training the trainer" course.
- noted again the increased costs being incurred by Irish training bodies arising from a
  greater involvement in UEMS Specialist Sections and European Boards and sought
  additional funding from the Department of Health to enable the Board to increase its
  contribution towards the costs involved,
- funded thirty general practitioner continuing education programmes/ schemes (GPCME schemes) based in Bray, Carlow/Kilkenny, Cavan/Monaghan, Clare, Cork [East, North, West, Cork City (2 schemes)], Donegal, Dublin [ICGP Faculty areas: Corrigan, Dublin South-West, Dun Laoghaire, Merrion, North Dublin, West Dublin/Kildare, William Stokes/ Mount Carmel (2 schemes)], East Midlands, Galway, Kerry, Laois/Offaly, Limerick, Louth/Meath, Mayo, Sligo/Leitrim, Tipperary, Waterford, West Midlands and Wexford/Avoca.
- continued to fund the appointments of a National Director and of an Assistant National
  Director of continuing education schemes, under the auspices of the Irish College of
  General Practitioners, to co-ordinate and encourage the development of the activities of
  the Tutors of such schemes, and to establish and maintain a bank of educational
  resources for use by small groups.
- facilitated the strategic management of the ICGP's General Practice Postgraduate Resource Centre and helped to fund that Centre,
- the Board's Chief Officer is a member of the Steering Committees of the Eastern Regional, Midland, Mid-Western, North-Eastern and South Eastern Training Programmes in General Practice,
- provided financial assistance towards the ongoing costs of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland Vocational Training Scheme for General Practice,
- conducted, in association with the ICGP, a national matching scheme for the July, 2000 trainee intake to the Vocational Training Programmes in General Practice. The matching scheme was operated by the Board on behalf of the ten Vocational Training Programmes and the National Association of Programme Directors,
- agreed to make funding available to the Western Health Board Training Programme in General Practice to enable that programme's directorate undertake the University of Wales, College of Medicine, Postgraduate Certificate Course in Medical Education,

- provided £9,000 as a contribution to the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI) to help defray some of the costs incurred by the RCSI in organising a management course for senior and specialist registrars,
- provided financial assistance to the RCSI to help in the funding of the Diploma Course in Management for Medical Doctors which is organised under the aegis of the RCSI and the Institute of Public Administration.
- provided financial support to the UCD-based Diploma Course in Healthcare Risk Management,
- provided financial assistance to the Faculty of Occupational Medicine to help fund the appointment of its Tutor/Co-ordinator for Multidisciplinary Core Training Courses in Occupational Safety and Health,
- contributed towards funding the costs levied on the RCPI in respect of its membership
  of the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges (in Ireland and in the UK),
- provided financial assistance to health boards, voluntary hospitals and to postgraduate centres to purchase teaching resources. Details are in the Accounts.
- provided financial assistance to the postgraduate training bodies in their exercise, as national bodies, of a general control over programmed training Details are provided in the Accounts. The Bodies so assisted comprise those listed at (i) to (x) on page 9 together with the Faculties of (a) Public Health Medicine, (b) Occupational Medicine and (c) Paediatrics the last three named bodies are Faculties within the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland.

- (f) participated in the management and administration of postgraduate centres and in the organisation of the programmes of activities in such centres.

#### Committees of the Board

During 2000, the Board had the following six Committees which had the task of examining and reporting to it on particular aspects of the Board's functions and activities:

Medical Affairs Committee, chaired by Professor M.X. Fitzgerald.

Finance Committee, chaired by Dr. C.S. Macnamara.

Dental Affairs Committee, chaired by Mr. T. Holland. This Committee deals with all aspects of dentistry relevant to the Board's functions other than continuing dental education.

Continuing Dental Education Committee, chaired by Mr. P. Connellan.

Strategic Management Committee of the ICGP General Practice Postgraduate Resource Centre chaired by Dr. C.S. Macnamara.

# Recognition of Professional Bodies

The Board has recognised ten main Irish professional bodies as filling major roles in programmed training. They are:

- (i) The College of Anaesthetists of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland;
- (ii) The Faculty of Dentistry of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland;
- (iii) The Irish College of General Practitioners;
- (iv) The Irish Committee on Higher Medical Training;
- (v) The Institute of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland;
- (vi) The Faculty of Pathology of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland;
- (vii) The Irish Psychiatric Training Committee;
- (viii) The Faculty of Radiologists of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland;
- (ix) The Irish Surgical Postgraduate Training Committee;
- (x) A Committee of the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, which deals with general professional training in Medicine.

# Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December, 2000

# Statement of Board Responsibilities

The Medical Practitioners Act, 1978, requires the Board to keep all proper accounts of all income and expenditure of the Board and of the sources of such income and the subject matter of such expenditure and all proper accounts of property, assets and liabilities of the Board. In preparing the financial statements, the Board is required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Board will continue in operation.
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Medical Practitioners Act, 1978. The Board is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Board and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

# Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December, 2000

## **Accounting Policies**

#### I General

The Postgraduate Medical and Dental Board was established in March, 1980 as a statutory body under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1978. Its function is to promote the development of postgraduate medical and dental education.

# 2 Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements are prepared under the accruals method of accounting, except as indicated below, and in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles under the historical cost convention. Financial Reporting Standards recommended by the recognised accountancy bodies are adopted, as they become operative.

The 2000 figures are presented in Euro and IR£. The exchange rate used for conversion was €1 = IR£0.787564.

### 3 Income

Oireachtas grants are accounted for on a cash receipts basis.

### 4 Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed assets are shown at cost or valuation less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis at 10% for furniture and fittings and 20% for office equipment.

# 5 Capital Account

The Capital Account represents the unamortised value of grants applied for capital purposes.

### 6 Superannuation

Section 19 of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1978 applies the terms of the Local Government (Superannuation) Act, 1956 to the Board and its officers, subject to any modifications which may, with the consent of the Minister for the Environment and Local Government, be determined by the Minister for Health and Children.

No provision is made for future superannuation benefits under the above arrangement.

Superannuation contributions are netted against the charge for salaries.
