I was greatly honoured to be elected Chairman of the Western Health Board (WHB) in 2001 and hope that my experience, including tenure as Minister of State for Health from 1987 to 1989, was of benefit to the organisation.

2001 was a year of unprecedented development and expansion of the Board's service – a golden age, in fact. Our building programme, across all services and counties, was extensive and the achievements in this regard are set out in detail in the body of this report.

Spending in healthcare in the past five years has increased dramatically and 2001 was another record year for our

revenue budget. It allowed us to hire hundreds of new staff to deliver the services our largely rural population have needed for so long – of course there is still a lot to do but we are now well positioned for the future.

My colleague Members worked hard in 2001. There were 15 meetings of the Board and 43 meetings of the various committees. We considered 108 reports, including eleven major Board Strategies and Plans. We approved seven property transactions, the most significant being the transfer of ownership and operation of Portiuncula Hospital. Ballinasloe and the purchase of the building and land in Tuam from the Bon Secours system. This was in addition to ongoing Capital Developments at University College Hospital, Galway (UCHG), Merlin Park Regional Hospital (MPRH), Mayo General Hospital (MGH) and Roscommon County Hospital (RCH). I thank the members for

their dedication, their courtesy and their co-operation with the Chairman over the year.

The Chief Executive Officer Dr Sheelah Ryan continues to lead by example and I commend her vision, tirelessness and her advice to me. I also thank her management and staff for their commitment and achievement during the year.

This Annual Report gives a flavour of the range and volume of services provided during 2001 to the people of Roscommon, Mayo and Galway and shows that the Western Health Board is living up to its Mission Statement and improving continuously.

Ba mhór an onóir dom gur toghadh mé mar Chathaoirleach ar Bhord Sláinte an Iarthair (BSI) i 2001 agus tá súil agam go ndeachaigh mo chuid taithí, mo thréimhse mar Aire Stáit sa Roinn Sláinte ó 1987 go 1989 san áireamh, chun leasa na heagraíochta.

Ní fhacthas cheana bliain mar 2001 leis an méid forbartha agus leathnaithe a rinneadh ar sheirbhís an Bhoird — d'fhéadfaí a rá gur ré órga a bhí ann. Bhí clár leathan tógála againn i ngach seirbhís agus i ngach contae, agus tugtar na sonraí faoin méid a bhaineamar amach sa réimse seo i gcorp na tuairisce seo.

Tháinig méadú drámatúil ar an gcaiteachas ar chúram sláinte le cúig bliana anuas agus ba

bhliain ar leith 2001 arís maidir lenár mbuiséad ioncaim. Chuir sé ar ár gcumas na céadta daoine nua a earcú dár bhfoireann chun seirbhís a sholáthar do dhaonra a chónaíonn faoin tuath den chuid is mó, daoine a bhí ina n-éagmais le fada - is cinnte go bhfuil go leor le déanamh i gcónaí ach tá muid ullmhaithe go maith don todhcháí anois.

D'oibrigh mo chomhbhaill go dian i 2001. Bhí 15 cruinniú den Bhord ann agus 43 cruinniú de na coistí éagsúla. Rinne muid 108 tuairisc a mheas, ina measc aon cheann déag mórstraitéisí agus pleananna de chuid an Bhoird. D'fhaomhaigh muid seacht mbeartas sealúchais, arbh é aistriú úinéireacht agus feidhmiú Ospidéal Phortiuncula i mBéal Átha na Sluaighe an ceann ba shuntasáí díobh, agus ceannach foirgnimh agus talún i dTuaim ó chóras Bon Secours. Rinneadh é seo de bhreis ar na forbairtí leanúnacha caipitil ag Ospidéal Choláiste an hOllscoile, Gaillimh, Ospidéal Réigiúnach Pháirc Mhuirinne, Ospidéal Ginearálta Mhaigh Eo agus Ospidéal Chontae Ros Comáin.

Ba mhaith liom mo bhuíochas a chur in iúl do na baill ar son a ndúthrachta, a gcuirteis agus a gcomhoibriú leis an gCathaoirleach i rith na bliana.

Leanann an Príomhoifigeach Feidhmiúcháin, an Dr Sighle Ní Riain, uirthi d'ár dtreorú lena dea-shampla féin, agus molaim a léargas, a cuid fuinnimh agus a comhairle dom féin. Gabhaim buíochas freisin lena bainisteoirí agus lena foireann as ucht a ndúthrachta agus an méid a chuir siad i gcrích i rith na bliana.

2001 was a busy and successful year for the Western Health Board. We continued to focus on frontline care. More than IR£417m - an average of IR£1,200 for every resident of Galway, Mayo and Roscommon - was spent delivering a broad range of health and personal social services. There was major change in the economy during the year, as Ireland was affected by economic slowdowns and recession elsewhere in the world.

This was accentuated by the tragedies in the United States on September 11th. Whereas the beginning of the year was characterised by a major drive to recruit staff and increase capacity and activity, it was clear by the end of the year that we were entering a phase of consolidation.

Activity again exceeded targets, particularly in our hospitals, whose efficiency continues to be recognised through case-mix: the favourable 2002 allocation reflects their performance in 2001. The overall high level of activity was further supported by a supplementary allocation late in the year.

Recruitment in 2001 was undertaken through focused project management because of the large numbers involved and the challenges in finding and attracting certain types of staff, particularly in the therapy grades. The Board worked with National University of Ireland, Galway in preparing its bid to the Higher Education Authority for the provision of Degree courses in some of these areas.

The Members of the Board were a source of direction and guidance during the year and I am very grateful to them for their dedication and

Chief Executive Officer's Overview

Ráiteas an Phríomhoifigeach Feidhmiúcháin

Ba ghnóthach agus ba ráthúil an bhliain í 2001 ag Bord Sláinte an Iarthair. Dhírigh muid mar is gnách ar chéad líne an chúraim. Caitheadh níos mó ná IR£417m – IR£1,200 ar an meán do gach duine i nGaillimh, Maigh Eo agus Ros Comáin, ar réimse leathan de sheirbhísí sláinte agus seirbhísí sóisialta pearsanta. D'athraigh an eacnamaíocht go mór i rith na bliana, de réir mar a chuaigh an lagthrá agus an meathlú eacnamaíoch in áiteanna eile ar fud an domhain i gcionn ar Éirinn.

Chéaraigh sé seo go mór de bharr tubaistí an Ilú Meán Fómhair sna Stáit Aontaithe. Ag tús na bliana bhí feachtas láidir ar siúl chun foireann a earcú agus chun inniúlacht agus gníomhaíochtaí a mhéadú, ach ba léir faoi dheireadh na bliana go mbeadh comhdhlúthú le déanamh go ceann tamaill.

Sháraigh na gníomhaíochtaí na spriocanna arís, go háirithe inár gcuid ospidéal, agus aithnítear a n-éifeachtúlacht sa chás-mheascadh: léiríonn cionroinnt fhabhrach 2002 chomh maith is a d'fheidhmigh siad i 2001. Tacaíodh leis an leibhéal iomlán gníomhaíochta le cionroinnt airgid bhreise go déanach sa bhliain.

Rinneadh an earcaíocht le linn 2001 trí bhainistiú dírithe ar thionscail de bhrí go raibh uimhreacha móra i gceist agus go bhfuil sé deacair cineálacha áirithe foirne a fháil, go háirithe i ngráid na dteiripeoirí. D'oibrigh an Bord le hOllscoil na hÉireann, Gaillimh ar iarratas a ullmhú le cur chuig an Údarás um Ardoideachas chun cúrsaí Céime a sholáthar i gcuid de na réimsí seo.

Bhí treoir agus stiúir le fáil ó Bhaill an Bhoird i rith na bliana agus tá mé fíorbhuíoch díobh as ucht a ndúthrachta agus as na cinnidh a rinne siad i bpáirt. Tá mé buíoch go háirithe den Dr Créagóir Ó Ceallaigh agus den Chomhairleoir Traolach Ó Loideáin, a bhí ina

collective decision making. In particular, I would like to thank Dr Greg Kelly and Cllr Terry Leyden, who Chaired the Board during 2001. The Board's purchase of Portiuncula Hospital was a highlight and I welcome all of this Hospital's fine staff to the Western Health Board family.

The development of the organisation was a focus in 2001. There was progress in several areas including the various TEAM initiatives, the setting up of the Corporate Analyst and the Corporate Learning & Development functions, further devolvement to and strengthening of General Management in the Hospital and Community sectors and the involvement of staff in the formulation of the new National Health Strategy, "Quality & Fairness". Personal

Development Plans were introduced in Galway Regional Hospitals.

Management/Union partnership continued through the work of RoundTable (established in 1997), the Board's partnership structure under the National Partnership Forum. Additional local partnership committees were set up in each of the counties, bringing the total to eight. The goal is coverage of the whole organisation by the end of 2002. Through partnership, policies have been developed in areas such as anti-bullying, sexual harassment, grievances and discipline.

The allocation received in 2001 allowed development across all programmes. The hospital and community services both benefited, as did several population groups in our area, including older people and those living with physical, sensory or mental disability. We worked in partnership with voluntary agencies of all sizes and further developed this relationship through formal service agreements with the larger organisations. Partnership between health boards took a big step forward with the establishment of HeBE, the Health Boards Executive. Partnership with our patients/clients/users grew, as did our engagement with our own staff and with the general public. Examples of this include the website, the intranet, the highly successful "Health Links" newspaper supplement, the

Náisiúnta Sláinte nua. 'Fiúntas agus Cothroime'. Cuireadh tús le Pleananna Forbartha Pearsanta in Ospidéal Réigiúnacha na Gaillimhe.

Lean an chomhpháirtíocht idir an Bhainistíocht agus na Ceardchumainn trí obair an Bhoird Chruinn (a bunaíodh i 1997), le struchtúr comhpháirtíochta an Bhoird faoin bhFóram Náisiúnta Comhpháirtíochta. Cuireadh coistí comhpháirtíochta breise ar bun i ngach ceann de na contaethe, ionas go bhfuil 8 gcinn ann anois. Tá sé d'aidhm againn an eagraíocht ar fad a chlúdach faoi dheireadh 2002. Rinneadh polasaithe a

fhorbairt i réimsí mar frith-mhaistíneacht, ciapadh gnéasach, gearáin, agus disciplín.

B'fhéidir forbairt a dhéanamh ar na cláracha go léir leis an gcionroinnt airgid a fuarthas i 2001. Ghnóthaigh na hospidéil agus na seirbhísí pobail araon dá bharr, mar a rinne roinnt grúpaí daonra inár gceantar, ina measc daoine scothaosta agus iad siúd a bhfuil éagumas fisiciúil, céadfaíoch nó meabhrach orthu. D'oibrigh muid i bpáirt le háisíneachtaí deonacha, idir bheag agus mhór, agus rinne muid tuilleadh forbartha ar an gcaidreamh seo trí chomhaontaithe foirmiúla seirbhíse leis na heagraíochta

innovative "Frankly Speaking" newsletter, satisfaction questionnaires, use of focus groups, and the continued expansion of the network of regional and local advisory committees.

2001 saw the single biggest development to date of the Board's role in health, as we continued to move from a healthcare model of sickness to one of wellness, of individuals and communities taking charge of their own health.

We continued to implement the major National Cardiovascular and Cancer Strategies, through initiatives ranging from health promotion and education, through local provision of specialised care, to rehabilitation and secondary prevention. The local availability of Heart Surgery and Radiotherapy will be key developments in this regard.

Planning and management of capital projects and the provision of technical services continued. As well as the development of new facilities, particularly through the large construction programmes at University College Hospital, Galway and Mayo General Hospital, there was significant

work in identifying emerging capital needs, including the upkeep of our existing building stock, as well as the maintenance and replacement of our equipment and our ambulance fleet. Striking a balance between development capital and "core" capital was a challenge and will continue to be a feature over the coming years.

September 11th, Foot & Mouth Disease and the Anthrax alert all combined to bring a focus on the comprehensiveness and adequacy of emergency planning, from the national level to that of the individual and the family. The Board's Ambulance Service and Public Health Department provided leadership in this

Forbairtí a bheidh an-tábhachtach maidir leis seo ná Máinliacht Croí agus Raiditheiripe a sholáthar go haitiúil.

Leanadh ar aghaidh le pleanáil agus le bainistiú na dtionscadal caipitil agus le soláthar na seirbhísí teicniúla. regard, both in responding to calls and perceived emergencies and in reassuring the public. A new Corporate Emergency Response Group was formed.

During the year, progress continued in the development of quality initiatives. This included largescale developments such as the Accreditation Project in Galway Regional Hospitals but also the many and varied initiatives and quality schemes operated in each county, across all services. Quality is now very much an everyday aspect of our work. Risk management became even more significant during the year and clinical

risk management expanded, particularly in our hospitals but also through the development of an organisation-wide framework and through the further development of complaints and feedback principles and processes. The Board continues to learn from its interactions with the Ombudsman and the Information Commissioner.

This Annual Report reflects the Service Plan for 2001. The Plan was approved by the Members of the Board and submitted to the Minister for Health & Children. The Board monitored it closely through its Standing Committees and

through full quarterly reviews. I am pleased to report that the Plan was substantially implemented and that the budgetary position at the end of the year was break-even. This would not have been possible without the continued dedication, hard work and commitment of our staff. I would like to once again express my gratitude to them.

Child Care & Family Support Services

- A Child & Family Research & Policy Unit, with particular emphasis on family support, has been set up with National University of Ireland, Galway to research current policies and establish best practice in line with the National Children Strategy 2000.
- The Board's Child Care Strategy has been formally approved and an operational plan to implement the organisational aspects is being advanced.
- A video and book for volunteers and voluntary bodies working with children have been completed.
- A Mobile Play Bus Service has been launched. Two Buses have been purchased and refurbished, one of which will service west County Galway. The other will be based in Galway City where initially it will serve Traveller halting sites.
- A new community-based project known as "The Edge Project" has been set up in Mayo to work with 12-16 year olds whose behaviour poses a risk to their health, safety, development and welfare.
- The Regional Child Health Project Manager has been appointed to drive the implementation process of 'Best Health for Children'.
- The Regional Child Health Committee is undertaking organisational development work with a view to developing an overall child and adolescent health strategy for the Board.
- We have extended our family support network to Westport, Castlerea, Tuam and Monksland.
- Up to 60 frontline staff from both the Health Board and Voluntary Agencies have received awareness training in respect of the Family Group Conferencing model.
- Western Health Board and Foróige mentoring training has been completed and matches have been agreed for young people.

- The Health Advice Café has been opened.
- We have commenced a research project on the Child Health Public Health Nursing Service.
- By ensuring that retail outlets comply with the tobacco legislation we are directly helping prevent ease of access to cigarettes to those under 18. We have exceeded our target of 2,550 inspections.
- Immunisation uptake rates in children 24 months of age is 82%. We have achieved 74% uptake of Meningococcal C Vaccination in 0-5 years of age, which is about 3% above the national average.
- Agreed standards for facilities in Health Centres where child health services are provided have been finalised.

Physical & Sensory Disabilities

- Access West, a guide to services, supports and a rights-based perspective for people with physical and sensory disabilities, has been launched in partnership with Enable Ireland.
- The new Brain Injury Rehabilitative Training Unit has been opened and is managed by Rehab on behalf of the Board.
- The Strategic Plan for Physical & Sensory Disabilities is being finalised through a collaborative partnership approach between statutory and voluntary agencies. The specific strategic plans for clients with strokes, visual impairment, progressive illness, brain injury, spinal injury, developmental disability, hearing impairment and amputation have been completed and are being incorporated into the overall Strategic Plan.

- We have allocated IR£4.092m to agencies providing services to people with a learning disability.

Environmental Health

- Our Environmental Health Services have been awarded ISO 9002. This is a measure of the quality of service provided by staff over a number of years.

Counselling

- For the second year the Board provided dedicated counselling to adults who had experienced abuse as children - with over 2,257 sessions during the year.

Asylum Seekers

- During the year we provided services to 3,155 Asylum Seekers.

Travellers Health

- We have commenced a consultation process with Travellers with the aim of determining their health needs and to gain a better insight into Travellers' attitudes and perceptions of health.
- As a follow on from the inter-cultural training awareness programmes with staff, cultural mornings have been held and a series of workshops have been run at Mayo General Hospital.

Services**

**Ár Seirbhísí
Meabhairshláinte**

Our Mental Health Services are in a period of transition from institutional to community care. The strategy on the provision of community-based services and the corresponding reduction in level of inpatient numbers continued in 2001.

In recent years, there has been a significant decline in our long-stay population which has been accompanied by the development of a community care structure, including day centres, high support hostels and training centres. The underpinning philosophy of care closer to home and client empowerment has enabled a patient-centred approach to service delivery.

The new Mental Health Act, which is expected to be implemented in the near future, will replace the existing legal framework which dates back to 1945. This legislation will strengthen patients' rights, particularly non-voluntary patients, and confer legal status on community-based facilities.

Challenges in 2001

Parallel costs will continue for the duration of the transition from inpatient care until the closure of the large psychiatric institutions.

Increasing cost of maintaining people in the community and increased number of people availing of community based services without a commensurate reduction in inpatient activity.

Achievements in 2001

- *Transfer of 21 residents from St Mary's Hospital, Castlebar to the Fairways, Swinford.*
- *Transfer of 10 clients from St Brigid's Hospital, Ballinasloe to new high support residences at Ballinasloe and Killimor.*

The Board's Strategy "Health & Wellbeing for Older People – A Strategy for 2001 – 2006" outlines a vision for services as well as key principles governing service delivery. The emphasis is on maintaining older people in their own homes for as long as possible.

There is a requirement to plan services that are appropriate and responsive to need and available as near as possible to where older people live. Ongoing evaluation is emphasised in the delivery of services that are based on assessed need, responsive to individual requirements and evidence-based.

Challenges in 2001

Financial implications of Ombudsman's report on Nursing Home subventions.

Difficulties in the recruitment of physiotherapists, occupational and speech therapists.

Population demographic factors, particularly increased longevity, have obvious demand implications for older people services.

Increased demand for beds in the Board's long-stay accommodation.

Increasing number of private nursing home beds and associated pressure on nursing home subvention budgets.

Increased demand for services due to a growing public awareness, especially in older people.

Achievements in 2001

- *Adoption of a Strategy for Older Peoples Services. "Health & Wellbeing for Older People – A Strategy for 2001 – 2006".*
- *Launch of Guidelines for practice in Promotion of Health in Older People.*
- *Completion of a Hospice Suite at Ballina District Hospital.*

Acute Services is responsible for the Board's Acute Hospitals, the Primary Care Department and the Materials Management Unit.

Our Acute Hospitals are University College Hospital Galway, Merlin Park Regional Hospital, Galway, Mayo General Hospital and Roscommon County Hospital. One of the main developments in this area in 2001 was the transfer of ownership of Portiuncula Hospital, Ballinasloe to the Western Health Board.

During 2001, we treated 54,562 In-Patients, provided 28,867 Day Case Treatments and Outpatients Consultations for 146,869 people. 102,373 people attended our A&E Departments.

Galway Regional Hospitals – University College Hospital Galway and Merlin Park Regional Hospital

Blocks 2A and 2B of the Phase II development in University College Hospital, Galway were completed, providing a new main entrance and foyer, restaurant, Medical Records Department, patient admissions area, Coronary Care Department, Angiography, Cardiac investigation area and a temporary Intensive Care Unit/High Dependency Unit.

These ongoing developments, while very welcome, have created a major challenge for hospital staff who had to continue to

provide 'business as usual' while the building work took place. The developments present a further challenge in the need to secure the required resources to operate and maintain these new services.

Achievements in 2001

Development of our role as a Regional Referral Centre, which greatly enhances the extent of services in a number of specialities in terms of:

- *Establishment of a Diabetes Day Care Centre, bringing together the multidisciplinary team needed to provide a quality service in one location.*
- *Continued development of an Oncology Regional Model, with satellite services in Mayo General Hospital and Portiuncula, which brings the service closer to the patient.*

- Appointment of an Orthodontics Specialist.
- Commissioning of a Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) service and the Tele-Radiology link with Clifden Hospital, County Galway.
- Enhancement of Social Work service in Renal and General Medicine at Merlin Park Regional Hospital.

- Development of post basic higher diploma courses in Oncology, Peri-operative care and Accident & Emergency.

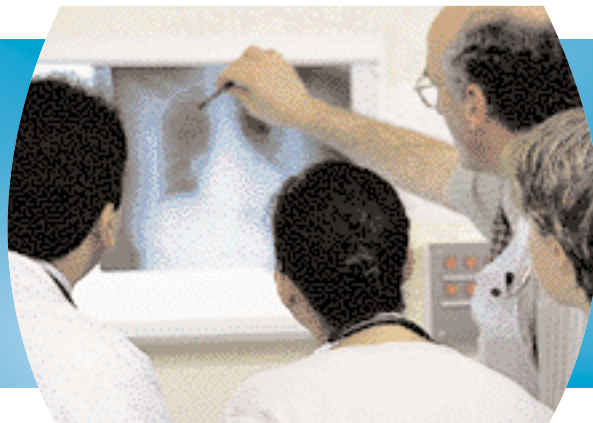
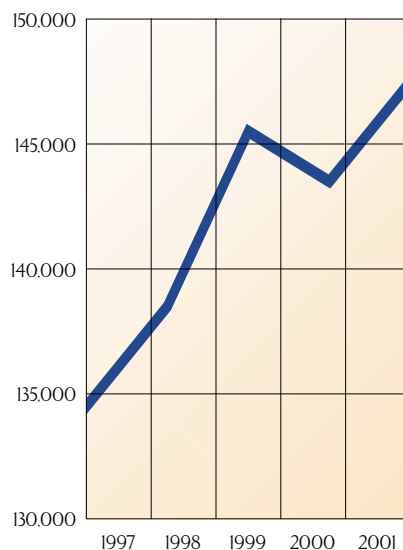
Mayo General Hospital

In-patient Admissions increased by 5% on the previous year and Day Cases rose by 41%. The numbers attending Out Patient Clinics increased by 15%.

Achievements in 2001

- Successful completion of the Phase II development which will greatly enhance the range of services and quality of facilities available to our patients. The new development included an Education Centre, upgrading of wards and laboratory environments, new Day Care ward and Medical Assessment wards. The challenge now is to consolidate the new services that have been established.

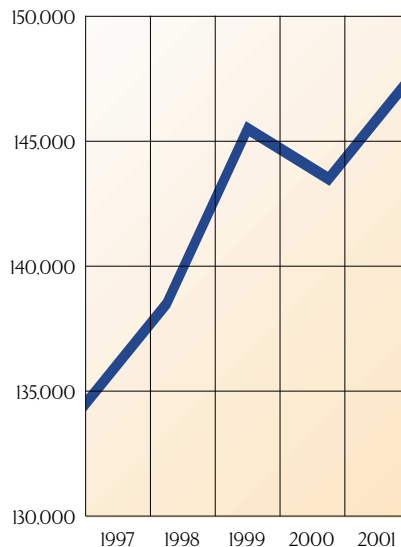

Roscommon County Hospital

A strategic alliance, which is being formed between Roscommon County Hospital and Portiuncula Hospital, will provide an integrated and efficient hospital service to the people of Roscommon and East Galway.

In 2001, inpatient targets were exceeded by 3% and outpatient targets by nearly 10% at Roscommon County Hospital.

Achievements in 2001

- Full planning permission was granted for the new Accident & Emergency Department.
- A state of the art X-Ray Screening Room was installed.
- Planning was progressed for the refurbishment of St Coman's Ward and the provision of a Remote Hospital Stores.

- A second Consultant Anaesthetist post was filled.
- Approval was received for the replacement of a permanent Consultant Radiologist and an additional Consultant Radiologist post: shared with Portiuncula Hospital.
- Permanent appointments were made to the posts of General Manager and Finance Officer.
- A Medical Manpower Manager was appointed, with commitment to Mayo General Hospital and Roscommon County Hospital.

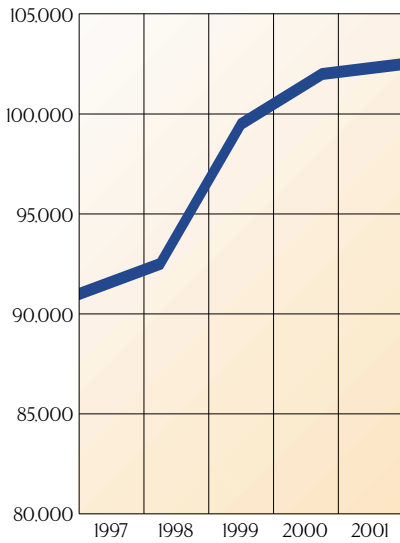

While preparations for the transfer of ownership of Portiuncula Hospital, Ballinasloe have been ongoing for two years, the actual transfer was effected in November 2001.

One of the over-riding achievements at Portiuncula Hospital last year was the improved access to hospital services for our patients. Oncology, Orthopaedics and Genito-Urinary medicine have all been brought closer to where people live and work through outreach clinics at Portiuncula.

The Primary Care Department is responsible for developing the General Practitioner and Community Pharmacy Services. The General Practitioners are the first port-of-call for the majority of patients accessing health services provided by the Board.

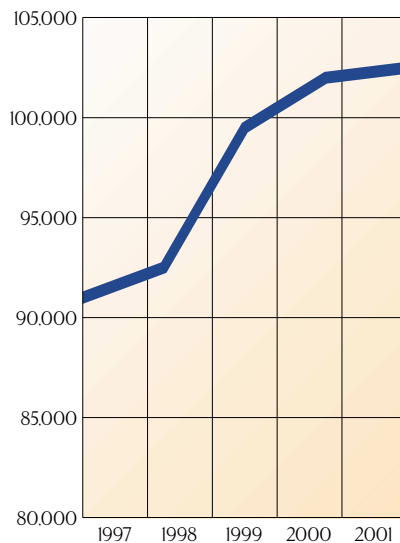

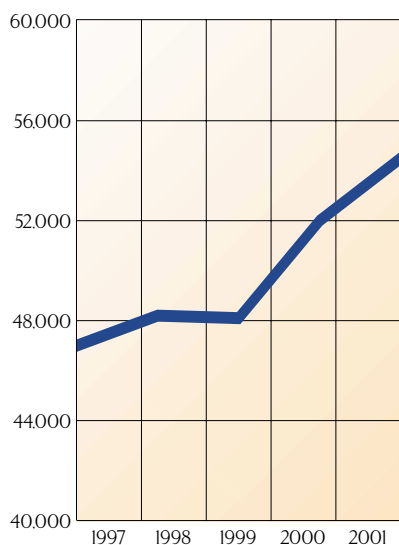

14 of the Board's supplies staff have completed the Certified Public Buyers Program of the US National Institute of Government Purchasing.

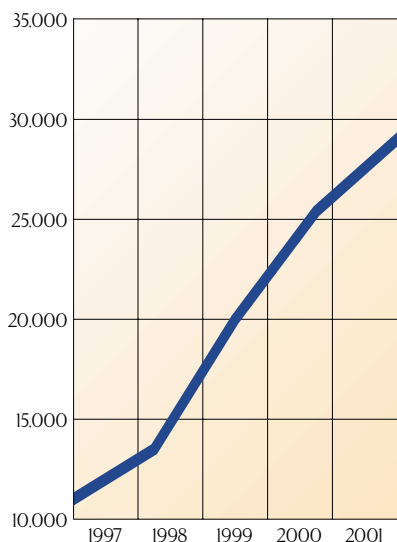
Orthodontics

Through a successful waiting list initiative, the numbers awaiting treatment were reduced from 2,214 in 2000 to 1,605 in 2001.

We were successful in recruiting a trained Specialist in Orthodontics in November 2001 and 2 Senior Clinical Dental Surgeons are undergoing sponsored higher level training and will complete their specialist training programme in June 2002. This will have very positive benefits in terms of increasing the service output of the Orthodontic Department.

The Regional Cancer Services Committee continues to oversee developments and to work with patients, the general public and service providers.

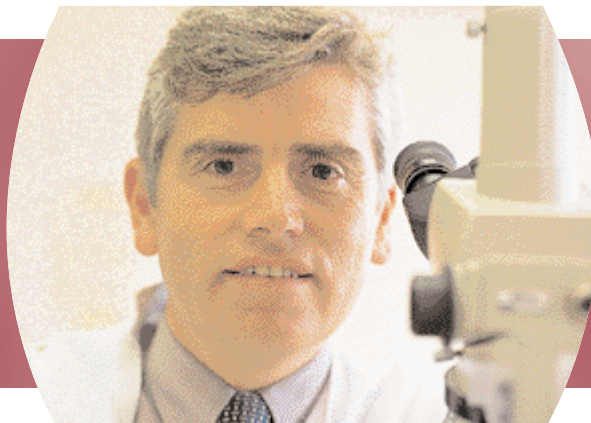



In 1999 Heart Disease and Stroke accounted for 41% of the total deaths in the Western Health Board Region and twice as many Irish people die prematurely of heart disease than the European Union average.

The Report of the National Cardiovascular Health Strategy Group 'Building Healthier Hearts' contains many recommendations to improve cardiovascular health and the Western Health Board has established a Regional Task Force to oversee the implementation of this Report.

A Project Team dedicated to improving the Cardiovascular Health of the population of Galway, Mayo and Roscommon has been established.

- Establishment of the East Galway/West Midlands Emergency Care Project to ensure that patients with acute cardiac problems receive the best possible care.
- Development of Community Action in Response to Emergencies (CARE) which provides training for volunteers in basic resuscitation procedures.
- Provision of 4 additional Community Nutritionists to the Department of Community Nutrition & Dietetics. Up to 1,270 patients have been seen at Community Dietetic Clinics within the Region.
- Completion of a needs assessment to allow for the development of a Nutrition Resource for Primary Schools.
- Research project on 'Factors contributing to the dietary practises of families with children under five years in the Galway Community services area.'
- Continuation of Personal Assistance in

Choosing Exercise (PACE) programme for staff and the community: 529 Galway, 135 Mayo, 185 Roscommon and 800 WHB Staff.

- Provision of stress management and lifestyle courses as part of the Cardiac Rehabilitation service in UCHG and MGH.
- Development of Community Cookery Classes for disadvantaged groups.
- Research projects, including an audit of Chest Pain admissions to each of the Acute Hospitals and a study of levels of computerisation in General Practices.
- Publication of the 'Heart of the West' information booklet which was distributed to every household in the Region.
- Availability of Phases I and II Cardiac Rehabilitation in RCH and MGH with the additional Phase III in place in UCHG and Portiuncula Hospital, Ballinasloe. 348 people have participated in Cardiac Rehabilitation at RCH and 373 at UCHG.

Of 60 Cardiovascular Health Strategy Western Health Board posts approved by the Department of Health & Children, 52 have been filled by the end of 2001, including:

- Cardiac Rehabilitation Co-ordinators for the Acute Hospitals, ensuring that patients now have rehabilitation facilities following a cardiac event.

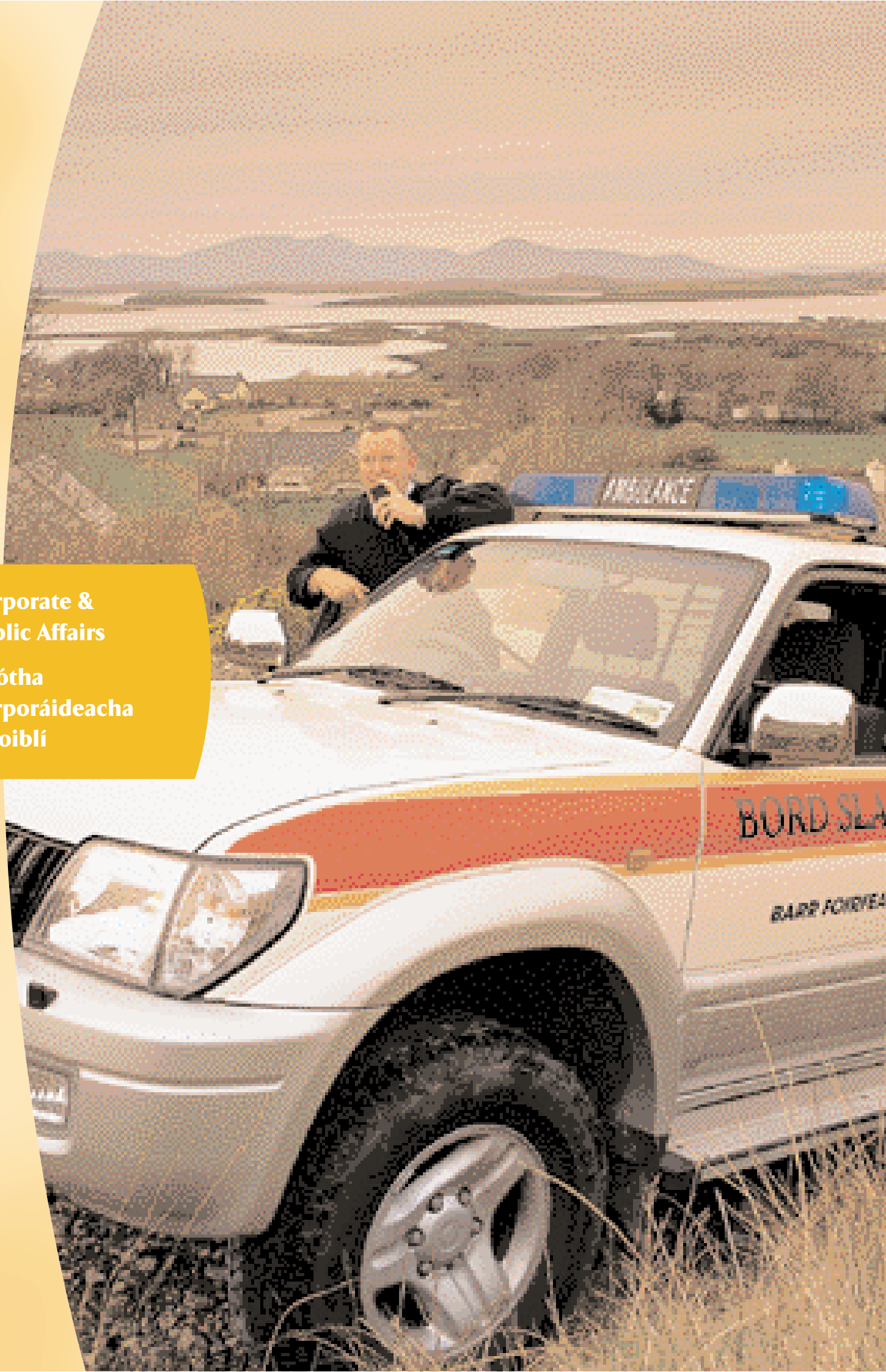

The Office has responsibility for Corporate & Public Affairs, Health Promotion and the Ambulance Service.

The Department's growing role in public affairs, ongoing health promotion initiatives and development of the Ambulance Service has had an extremely constructive and beneficial impact on the quality of services we are delivering to patients

Achievements in 2001

- Organised a consultation process and information roll-out for the new National Health Strategy: 'Quality & Fairness - A Health System for You', involving 35 workshops for consultation and 120 workshops for the roll-out process.
- Continued liaison with the Office of the Ombudsman and implemented a new database to record complaints referred by the Ombudsman.
- Participated in advanced training in Freedom of Information to improve the quality of replies to Freedom of Information appeal requests.
- Started development of a Complaint/Feedback System for the Board.
- Launched a Service Planning Pilot Initiative to encourage all staff to become more involved in Service Planning and devised a consultative process for nurses/midwives and staff on service planning.
- Prepared an information leaflet on key points from the Men's Health Strategy.
- Published five issues of the staff newsletter 'Frankly Speaking'.
- Continued implementation of 'Promoting Health in the West' through the Health Promotion Management Group.
- Liaised with local and regional government through participation on the Border, Midlands & Western Regional Assembly and Galway City Development Board.
- Prepared and circulated the Board's first Pocket Diary for 2002, which includes health promotion tips, information on the Board's services, public bodies and voluntary organisations.

- Awarded the Board's first central contract for hired transport, which involved establishing a group to represent service requirements, advertising the contract in EU journals and ensuring adequate service provision in the Region.
- Continued development of a Corporate Strategy for the Board.
- Co-ordinated the production of the Board's Operational & Service Plan, which identifies what the Board is going to do in terms of services in any given year.
- Prepared the Board's Annual Report.
- Participated on RoundTable Committee and sub-committees – the Department has been centrally involved in RoundTable since its inception.
- Adopted a Risk Management framework, following a national agreement to change the way Health Boards are insured from separate clinical and organisational systems to an integrated scheme called Enterprise Liability.
- Formed the Corporate Emergency Response Group, which oversees response capabilities, Public Health Outbreak Protocols, Helplines and Counselling Services. Events such as September 11th and Foot & Mouth outbreak had a major effect on the organisation and brought a major focus on our contingency and emergency planning.
- Started a Critical Incident Stress Management Group, which has audited activity, and developed a framework for a corporate approach to stress management.
- Participated in a major Corporate Recruitment Drive for 2001 – up to 700 extra staff have been recruited to the Board.

Ambulance Services

- Ambulance mileage increased by almost 15%, mainly in the area of patient transfers between medical facilities.
- General ambulance calls increased by 26%.
- The number of patients carried by Western Health Board ambulances increased by 16.5%.

- A new shift system was installed in Galway to cater for Merlin Park Regional Hospital's transfer needs.
- A programme to fit loading ramps on ambulances commenced to address health & safety needs within the service.

Health Promotion Department

Health Promotion is a complex discipline that involves an integrated approach to topics, settings, groups and overall population health. The Health Promotion Department has a role in capacity building, providing a variety of core services and implementing new initiatives in partnership with others.

The Department expanded significantly in 2001 with our staff compliment increasing from eight to twenty. Health Promotion Departments in Galway and Roscommon relocated to new premises.

Settings - The Settings approach focuses on the whole setting e.g. home, schools, workplaces, hospitals or community. In this approach, individuals are not treated in isolation from the larger social units in which they live, work and play.

Health Links - Four issues were published containing articles from a variety of interest groups and 130,000

copies of each publication were distributed regionally.

Community Education Courses -

A variety of courses on assertiveness, stress management and back-pain were completed, in conjunction with a number of different community groups in Tuam, Boyle, Ballina and Castlebar.

Schools - Social Personal Health Education (SPHE) support team for the Western Health Board Region was established. Further support for SPHE and the Health Promoting School was provided in the form of school visits, in-service training for principals, co-ordinators, teachers and whole staff training days. A successful conference was also held - 'Promoting Mental Health in the context of SPHE'.

Third Level Colleges - A health promotion programme for students and staff in Third Level Colleges was initiated, with a view to establishing Health Promoting Colleges in three years.

GROUPS

The Population approach addresses the concerns of a particular population e.g. homeless, smokers, older people and teenagers.

Travellers - We are continually facilitating 'Traveller Friendly Workshops' with Health Board staff in key areas to increase their awareness when working with Travellers. A sub-group, facilitated by the Health Promotion Department, has been set up to look at the training resources for those with low literacy levels.

Drivers - 10,000 Air Fresheners, carrying the WHB logo, were produced and disseminated to promote smoke-free driving.

Initiatives for Health Board Staff -

A three month smoking cessation programme called 'You quit, we pay' was run targeting WHB staff. There were 60 participants on the programme who were given free Nicotine Replacement Therapy, along with support from Health Promotion Staff.

The Topics approach focuses on issues such as smoking, drugs or alcohol.

Personal Assistance in Choosing Exercise (PACE)

- A one-to-one consultation encouraging people to become more physically active was successfully run for the first time in 2000. Following its effectiveness as a proven method to help increase people's physical activity levels, it was offered in 2001 not only to the public but also to WHB staff. Over 820 members of the public and staff availed of the service.

TRAINING

Brief Intervention Training - Three courses were organised in the Region.

Radio Training - Two courses were organised.

Group Skills - Three courses were organised.

RESEARCH

Partnership - Working Horizontally in a Vertical World' - A discussion paper on partnerships for promoting health in the WHB context.

Mental Health Promotion - 'Promoting Mental Health in the West - A survey of Mental Health in the Western Health Board' was published.

Evaluation of Health Promotion Community Education Courses (Galway) - Published in November 2001.

PARTNERSHIPS

Health Promotion is represented on over 40 Groups at National, Regional and Local level. Some successes on these Groups are as follows:

Older People - Guidelines for Practice in Promoting the Health of Older People were produced.

Violence - Conference held in September with 140 people attending.

Suicide - A regional plan was produced in 2001 - 'A Shared Endeavour'.

Accidents - Worked in conjunction with the Local Authorities for Fire Safety Week and also in conjunction with the Gardai regarding Road Safety.

Health Promotion - 'Promoting Health in the West' Strategy Implementation 2001.

Over 100 health promotion initiatives have been undertaken across a wide range of services in 2001. These initiatives include lifestyle programmes, mental health promotion, education & training and improvement in communication. Examples of these include an extensive Mental Health Report, appointment of a Pastoral Care Worker for Community Nursing Units in Mayo, an Older Persons Conference and a Schools Conference. Overall the profile of health promotion has increased significantly throughout the Board.

Public Health
Sláinte Poiblí

The Public Health Department has a central role in improving the health of the population of the Western Health Board by developing surveillance systems, identifying health care needs and working with planners to meet those needs. The Department provides direct resources for frontline staff in the fields of Infectious Disease, Cardiovascular Health, Cancer and Child Health.

The Department's research function allows us to evaluate front line services and to participate in changes, which will be of direct benefit to the consumer. Ways in which these have been achieved in 2001 are detailed as follows:

- *Implementation of the Regional Cancer Plan has continued and the Department has worked closely with Acute Services in developing a plan for the development of breast cancer services at University College Hospital, Galway, to be implemented during 2002.*
- *Implementation of the Regional Cardiovascular Health Strategy has progressed with appointments to over 50 new related posts.*
- *We continue to be involved nationally and regionally in advancing the aims of 'Best Health for Children' and a Regional Project Manager has been appointed.*
- *The Department has almost completed an evaluation of Day Surgery in University College Hospital, Galway.*
- *A Surveillance Officer has been appointed in partnership with the National Disease Surveillance Centre.*
- *The Department has continued to manage outbreaks of infectious disease.*
- *Information on infectious disease and immunisation has improved and new reporting systems with the National Disease Surveillance Centre are in place.*
- *A Quality/Audit function has commenced with the appointment of a Quality & Implementation Officer.*
- *We are participating in a study on Health & Social Service needs for Refugees & Asylum Seekers with Trinity College Dublin.*
- *Research Projects in progress include 'Performance Indicators in Child Health', 'Evaluation of Child Health Public Health Nurse Service', 'Evaluation of Travellers' perceptions of their health needs', and 'Evaluation of a Training Programme on Health Promotion for Older People'.*
- *The Department continues to be a training facility for a number of disciplines, including Third Level students and the National Training Programme for Specialist Registrars in Public Health Medicine.*
- *A permanent joint Lecturer/Specialist appointment between National University of Ireland, Galway and the Western Health Board has been made and we continue to work in partnership with academic departments.*
- *The Department has an advisory role in a cohort study which will investigate Child Health & Development outcomes.*

The Human Resources

Department encompasses all aspects of the structures, processes and activities that contribute to the planning, recruitment and development of all the Board's staff. It enables the other departments in the Board to deliver their services to patients by providing the right people for the right jobs.

The activities carried out by the Human Resources Department include Recruitment, Employee Relations, Corporate Learning & Development, Personnel, Payroll, Attendance & Recruitment System (PPARS), Superannuation, Occupational Health and the Nursing & Midwifery Planning & Development Unit.

In 2001, the successful completion of the first phase of restructuring the Human Resources Department occurred with the:

- Appointment of a Director of Human Resources.
- Appointment of a Corporate Learning & Development Manager.
- Appointment of Human Resources Officers in the Community services areas of Galway, Mayo and Roscommon.
- Enhancement of the Human Resources Team in Univesity College Hospital, Galway.

Achievements in 2001

- Work commenced on the development of the Human Resources Strategy, which aims to encompass the priorities of the new National Health Strategy 'Quality & Fairness - A Health System for You' and the recommendations of the Labour Relations Commission Review on Industrial Relations in the Health Service.
- Completion of the Phase I development on PPARS, a computer-based system for Payroll, Personnel, Attendance, Rostering & Superannuation.
- Inclusion of applications for all posts advertised by Human Resources on the Board's website.
- Delivery of Corporate Induction Programmes to new Western Health Board staff in Galway, Roscommon and Mayo on a monthly basis.

- Provision of an effective service by the Superannuation Section to ensure prompt payment of entitlements and advice to all Western Health Board staff.

- In total, 658 competitions were held with 1,045 appointments and 710 development posts were created.

Nursing & Midwifery Planning & Development Unit

There are over 5,000 nurses and midwives employed by the Western Health Board, with additional services provided to the private and voluntary sector that employ nurses.

Achievements in 2001

- Expansion of the Practice Development areas to include a Practice Development Co-Ordinator for Public Health Nursing within the Mental Health Nursing Service and a Lecturer/Practitioner post in Mental Health Nursing.
- Establishment of benchmarking processes to help improve

communication and enable the sharing of best practice procedures.

- Preparation of new services through needs assessment and specialist education, including the identification of posts for, and the appointment of, Clinical Nurse/Midwifery Specialists.
- Formation of Quality Initiative Pilot Sites, focussing on the implementation of individualised care planning through the empowerment of staff and patients.
- Preparation of the integration of the Pre-registration Nursing Degree Programme with current clinical and teaching services.
- Development of post-registration continuing education programmes within a corporate framework
- A Regional Multi-disciplinary Continuing Education group was formed to guide the development of educational programmes.

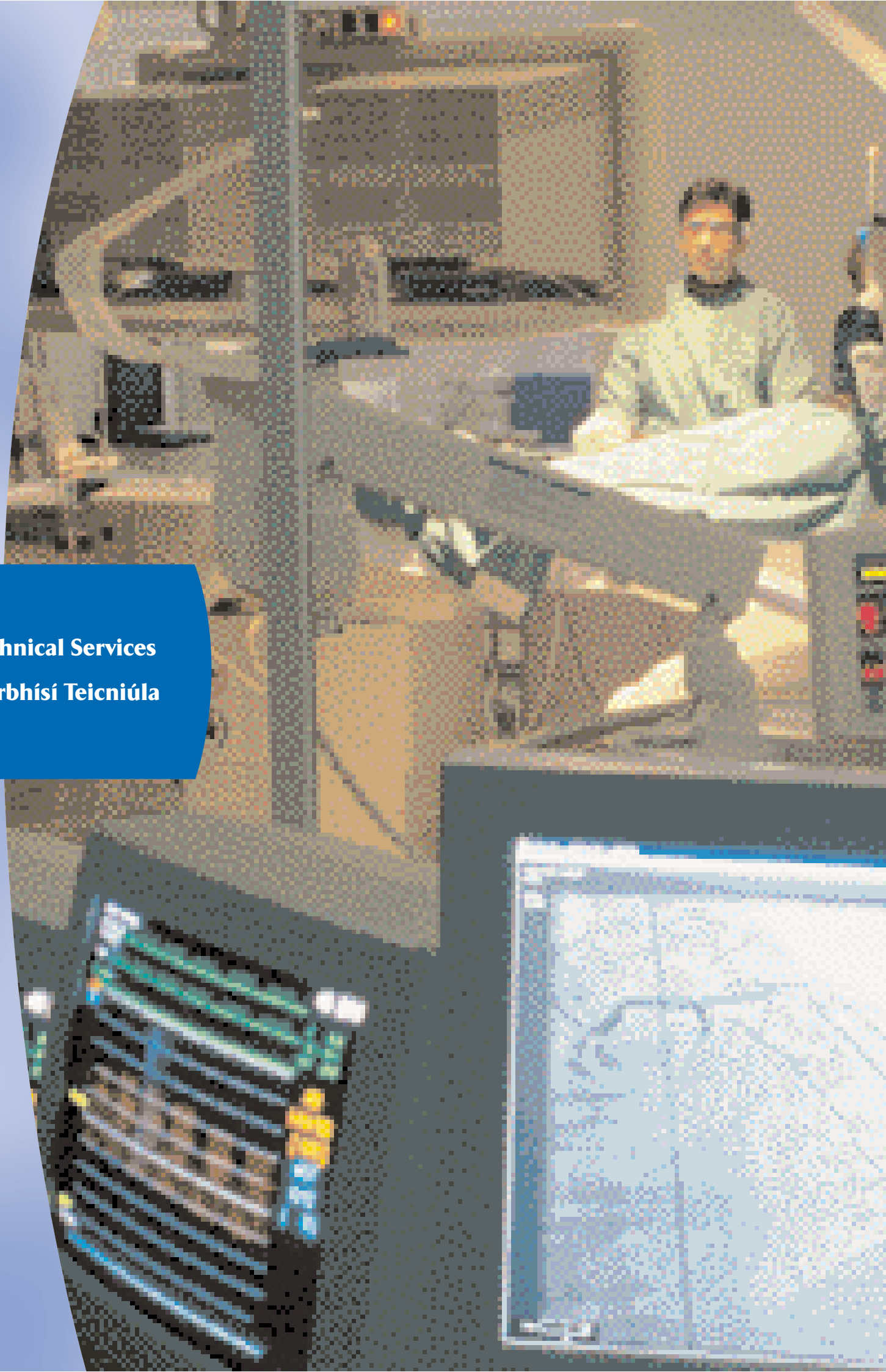

Finance
Airgeadas

The Western Health Board's funding allocation for 2001 was IR£444 million - an increase of IR£92.5 million on the previous year. Of this increase IR£49.8 million was for pay awards and price increases and IR£42.6 million for improvements and developments across a very wide range of services.

2001 was a year of unprecedented growth and development and this was a huge challenge in getting all the service developments into place. We exceeded our Service Plan activity targets and ended the year balanced to within 0.15%.

Achievements in 2001

- We continued to partake in the implementation of the PPARS project.
- We played a major role in the purchase negotiations and integration of Portiuncula Hospital and assessed the insurance implications involved in taking over the Hospital.
- We integrated 1,500 part-time Home Help staff onto the payroll system.
- We completed the inventory of land and buildings for the National Property Register.
- We automated payments to the large voluntary organisations.
- We upgraded to a new version of the General Ledger for improved management reporting purposes.
- We managed the conversion of financial systems, equipment and stationery for Euro Conversion and trained and prepared staff and clients while normal services continued throughout the Conversion process.

Challenges in 2001

- Nursing Homes – payment of top-up subventions, increase in rates, demand and dependency, once-off payment of pocket money arrears.
- Increase in demand for and cost of cancer and other high technology drugs.
- Significant increase in insurance premiums.
- Significant increase in activity in Acute Hospitals.
- Staff Recruitment and Accommodation costs.
- Mayo General Hospital – commissioning Phase 2 development with a very tight budget.
- Ambulance – increase in demand and additional crews for health & safety reasons.
- Older Persons – need for Respite Beds and Day Care facilities in our Community Nursing Units.
- Health & Safety/Risk Management expenditure.

Appointments

- 3 Management Accountants to Community Services in Galway and Mayo and Mayo General Hospital.
- An Accountant to manage the financial aspects of our relationship with the voluntary organisations – to which we have funded about IRE39 million.
- A Financial Systems Project Manager to lead the Board's team in the conjoint procurement of new financial systems.

Prompt Payment of Accounts Act, 1997

During the year the total number of late payments was 8,103 and they were on average 16 days over the due date. The total value of these payments was IRE4,363,335 with associated penalty interest payments of IRE18,053. Approximately 97% of all payment demands were paid within the prescribed timeframe, i.e. 45 days.
